

         possible year round settlement

Puron Phase - 2.300 - 1,500 BC
        poorly known
        technology - marked by first appearance of pottery
Ajalpan - 1,500 - 850 BC
         12 small hamlets/villages with permanent houses
         stream site locations
         public architecture by end of phase
         technology - marked painted pottery and ceramic figures
