What is a Learning Organization?

A learning organization is an organization skilled at:

- creating, acquiring, interpreting, transferring, and retaining knowledge, and
- purposefully modifying its behavior to reflect new knowledge and insights.

The Learning Process

All learning processes, for individuals as well as organizations, involve three stages:

- acquiring information
- interpreting information
- applying information

Acquiring Information

Three forms:

- Search
- Inquiry
- Observation

Successful information gathering requires:

- Collecting data from diverse sources
- Cross-checking findings to ensure validity
- Probing for interpretations and implications
