- Forest Hills Gardens, Queens, NY (1911)
- Sunnyside Gardens, Queens, NY (1924)
- Radburn, NJ (1928),
- Chatham Village, Pittsburgh (1932)
- Baldwin Hills Village, LA (1941)
- Greenbelt cities (1934)

Forest Hills Gardens (1911)

- Developed by Russell Sage Foundation
- RR suburb, 9 miles from Manhattan
- Clarence Perry neighborhood unit based on school within ½ mile and neighborhood shops within ¼ mile and common place for neighborhood institutions; arterial streets on outside to keep cars out.
